The Advent Season has finally arrived. Some might have been waiting all year. However, for those here at Mt Nebo, we had a foretaste of this special celebration in July! It all started with an idea from our Music Minister, Dr. Rose Gamblin, during one of our weekly staff meetings. It was her idea to do something special - something different during the slow months of summer.

This special celebration would be Christmas in July. It was a foretaste of what we could expect in a short six months - the joy and anticipation of the birth of the Christ child.

During our celebration of Christmas in July, it gave us an opportunity to forget the cares of the world, to be lighthearted and to be able to look at the world with the awe and wonder of a child again. Sometimes we just need to stop and disconnect from the world for the benefit of our own mental health – to be freed from the complexities of this world to reflect on the importance of our faith in God.

It also reminds us of what God expects from us as adopted members of his family. It is a reminder

of what it means to be a Christian. We are a called people – called to compassionately reach out to those that are marginalized in our society. We are called to sacrifice our own needs so that others may be served. We see this in the ministries we support,

from Volunteers in Mission (VIM) to Micah's Backpack, and all the in-between ministries we support. Each year we have expanded this number and at times have gone far beyond the boundaries of Washington County. It reminded us that we are called to open our hearts for the joy that God has intended for all of us. We serve with joy – the joy that is God-given through His grace. Our Christ-

mas in July made a statement to our community that we are passionate in our faith every day of the year – not just during special seasons.

And now, once again, we are reminded as we approach the birth of the Christ Child, through the joining together of the wonder of childbirth with the wonder of God's saving work. It invites us to consider how the experience of "expecting" teaches us something about the ways of God's gracious work in human experience. We wait with great hope and expectation for what is to come. Every birth is a sign of salvation, of finding favor with God, of being blessed, of living with promise, and of realizing its fulfillment. It is a universally felt human experience. It is something each one of us feels when the Holy Spirit comes into our hearts and we feel ourselves overwhelmed with gratitude and joy and a feeling of deep assurance and love.

This same feeling was felt by Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist, when Mary, the mother of Jesus, greeted her and Elizabeth exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women,

and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a ful-

fillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord." (Luke 1:42-45).

Elizabeth was not talking just about the baby growing in her womb. She was talking about the experience of being filled with the Holy Spirit. She was talking about the joy of being in God's holy presence. She was talking about the assurance of our faith. She was talking about the miraculous

uplifting we know when we consider the gift of Christ to this world and to each of us.

When have you felt the presence of God so deeply that you felt your heart leap for joy inside of you? Maybe it was during an Emmaus Walk weekend, or at a revival, or in a study group or a Sunday school class, or in worship, perhaps during the singing of a particular hymn. It is that sense of knowing that you are in the presence of God. It is feeling the presence of the Holy Spirit deep within your heart. Some have felt it at the moment when someone they loved was passing from this life into the next. Others have known God's presence during a particularly difficult time in their life, and they felt the prayers of their church family lifting them up. It can happen each morning when we wake up and find ourselves just grateful to be alive. It happens when we feel surrounded and held by people who truly love us. It's different for everybody. The Holy Spirit comes to us in many different ways. God always meets each of us in just the right place for us personally. Whatever way it comes to us, it is always a moment when we feel our hearts leap for joy because we know that we are in the presence of Christ.

Now that the time for celebration is drawing very near, let us await in patient anticipation for that joy that surpasses all joy – the birth of our Lord and Savior. Jesus Christ! Amen.



10 POUNDS MAKES ALL THE DIFFERENCE! Losing weight just to look good is missing the point. Sure, if you look good you feel better about yourself and your self-esteem increases. However, you can also feel better about yourself when giving to the needy, planning a great party, completing a college course, etc.

Losing weight is so much more. With a healthy weight you reduce your chances 30% in different cancers. You can also reduce your chances of getting type 2 diabetes. Most importantly, your body, especially your knees and feet, will appreciate weight loss the most!

Did you know 1 pound over your ideal weight puts 4 pounds of pressure on your knees and 6 pounds of pressure on your feet? So just by losing 10 pounds of unwanted weight, you will reduce 40

pounds on your knees and 60 pounds on your feet. Could you imagine carrying around a 40 or a 60-pound child all day? Focus on losing that first 10 pounds and see what a difference it will make.
