As we enter the month of February, we look forward to celebrating Valentine's Day. A day where we offer expressions of our love to those around us that mean so much to us in our challenging journey through life.

As I reflect on this special time, chapter 13 of the Apostle Paul's first letter to the Corinthians comes to mind. Many of you may already be familiar with these words written over 2000 years ago to the ancient church in Corinth. It was a time that this Christian community was struggling with just getting along with each other. In this passage, Paul delivers the following powerful poetic message of

love: "Love is patient, love is kind, it does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, and always perseveres. Love never fails."

I have often wondered how a man like Paul, who had never married, nor had children, could understand the meaning of love so well. Maybe it is because he had spent so much of his life without love and that when he received it, through the outpouring of the Spirit of Christ on that road to Damascus, he could understand it far better than most - to be able to understand it in the way it is described in 1st John, Chapter 4, Verse 16a, that "God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them."

I believe that this beautifully written poetic passage should be internalized so that we can successfully face all the trials and tribulations that we may encounter in our personal lives. By understanding how we are called to love, we will better endure the times in our lives that cause stress and

conflict. Indeed, there will be times of struggle when the advice from Paul to an ancient church that couldn't get along, will be as relevant to you today in the 21st Century as it was the day it was written.

In these times, you will see that our love for each other will be the glue that will keep our families and communities together. It will be needed in good measure for those times when we are overwhelmed with the challenges of daily routines that tend to, at times, overwhelm our abilities to cope and maintain our sanity. It may be a time at home when a child has been up all night sick and crying

- at a time when you and your spouse are exhausted, just wanting five more minutes of sleep - negotiating who will get up this time!

It will be needed in good measure in your relationship when you are overcome with anger and frustration over finances. When there are more expenses than income with more on

the way. It will be needed when the car breaks down, or the washing machine doesn't wash. There will be many times that it will be this kind of love that will pull you through – through all the hardships that life can throw at you – when your loving family and community reaches out and protects and preserves you by "circling the wagons" in your times of need.

Even in good times, love will amplify your joys and hopes in times such as the birth of a child - the delight and joy of the grandparents and family. Those first steps, thoroughly documented with hours of video – the rejoicing at family dinners and on vacations, a fullness of life that can only be experienced with love in our hearts, abiding in God who is love and who abides in us when we love. And even though you will go through good

times and bad times, love will be the bond – love will preserve and protect because as the Apostle Paul tells us, love never fails.

Always remember that the lost opportunities for love and family in our lives, those special moments, can never be re-lived or recovered. So, live your lives wisely, full of love surrounded by family and community. Never allow those special heartfelt moments that serve to bring us closer to God and each other escape you. Write these words of Paul upon your hearts so that they will always be close and will serve you in your times of need.

When you finally get the hang of the ups and downs of life, whatever your age, it will be this type of love that will give you such immense joy and contentment that you will understand why it was worth all the effort, and you will pray to God with thanksgiving for all your blessings.

Let your love for each other be a shining example for all to see, not only on Valentine's Day, but for all the days of your lives. Amen.
